Have and do bequeath my son West A. Williams of the District of Andover and State of William  
and as for other goods causes and considerations me thinketh moving have given and  
granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and released, and by their present devise, grant to his wife  
Anne Bell, Convey, and release unto the said West A. Williams, the following named lands w<sup>t</sup>th  
and personal estate. That is to say, All that large body of Land Situated in the State of  
said District of Andover, beginning at Saluda River at Elijah Estey line & thence  
up the same River to Thomas Rinnans line then along the dividing line betw<sup>n</sup>  
my self on the one side and Thomas Rinnan, John Charles, Franklin Sullivan, the widow &  
Jones, Estate of Miss Pinel, Jacob Roberts, Samuel Roberts, Henry Woodson, & munt  
Elijah Estey on the other side to the beginning comw. also on other Tract of the S<sup>t</sup> C<sup>r</sup>  
Station of Land Situated in Andover District on Canoe Creek and nearly opp<sup>t</sup> Elizabeth C<sup>r</sup>  
-key Creek containing One hundred and ninety Six acres (296) being a part of a P<sup>t</sup> S<sup>t</sup> C<sup>r</sup>  
tract containing Six Hundred acres, augmented to me on 25<sup>th</sup> June 1841 excluding the  
land and forty acres bought by me to Sarah Ann McIlwain wife of  
Mr W<sup>t</sup> B. McIlwain also the following named slaves to wit Peter, the blacksmith and  
his wife Mary and their five children, Sarah, Alfred, Willsey and Martha also Frank  
and Esmeralda and two fine children, Fiddy, Sarah, Lucy, Mary-ann and a male  
healy child not named also Rosamund, Dair<sup>e</sup>, Morning and two children, Heath  
and Angel and also a rather aged woman slave named Apphobia

Whereas it is declared to be the true intent of this Deed to alter and  
conclude the seventh, eighth, and ninth clauses of my Last Will and Testament executed  
29th June 1846 and also the tenth and eleventh clauses of my codicil executed 14th  
March 1847 and to convey the entire property herein mentioned and the income of the same  
directly to the said Wm A Williams and adding Apollonia now mentioned in this  
Will as codicil and to cause the said Will and Codicil to take full force in all other parts.

To have and to hold all and singular the lands and slaves  
- said unto the said West H. Williams his heirs and assigns forever. And I further do  
do hereby expressly save and reserve to myself the use possession and enjoyment of  
the entire property aforesaid for and during the term of my natural life. And I the  
said Samuel Williams do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators by  
warrant and process defend the property real and personal before mentioned unto the  
said West H. Williams his heirs and assigns from and against myself my heirs and  
all and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming to claim the same or any part thereof.
