South Carolina) We now all know by these present  
Grenville District that I Henry Smith of the  
State and District aforesaid in consideration of  
the sum of five hundred dollars to me paid  
at this place have granted bargained sold and released  
to James Reese of the same place have granted bargained sold and released  
to him three parcels of land lying and situate all that plantation or tract  
and containing one hundred and twenty four acres (more less) unto the said James  
Reese being a part of the tract of land wherein William Elliott Deceased known  
as the upper survey lot number three resurveyed and laid out by Samuel Moore,  
taken according to said survey situated and lying in the state and District of named  
one of the Branches of the Pee Dee fork waters of Reedy River. Beginning in or at a  
Spanish Oak 3x thence S $\frac{1}{2}$  E $\frac{1}{2}$  85 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  to a stake 3x thence S $\frac{1}{2}$  W $\frac{1}{2}$  4 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  across small  
wood by a pine and Hickory stations to Black Jack 3x bending on left and  
said Smith Land thence N 20 E 10 1/2 S. Bed Oak 3x Thence N 60 E 4 50 to stake 3x  
N 30 W 29 1/2 to stake and across a branch or creek thence N 15 E 12 1/2 to the  
wing corner on this line a Post Oak station. The above transfer is to be taken accord-  
ing to the original survey made the 18<sup>th</sup> day of September 1845 then in 1847 16<sup>th</sup> Octo-  
ber unto three tracts the above being lot number three. Together with all and sing-  
ular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the premises belong-  
ing in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular  
premises above mentioned unto the said James Reese his heirs and assigns forever  
I do hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns to warrant and forever defend the  
singular the said premises against myself my heirs and every other person whomsoever  
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
