Early Esqrs as my counsel to defend me in said case and have obtained an order to be admitted to bail and my friends John G. Davis, Joel Charles, Jacksdale Charles, Peter G. Charles, James McCallough and others, Dr. T. Edwin Ware and Benjamin Arnold and Wesley Robertson have entered into bail in accordance with me as my bail under said order. Whereas I am willing and considerate of the premises to secure my said attorneys for their professional services already rendered and to be rendered in said case a liberal compensation between them and myself upon the termination of said case as well as for any debts I may owe them or any of them and also to indemnify and save harmless the aforesaid Gentlemen who have become my bail as aforesaid from all loss and liability which they may sustain or incur by my bail aforesaid. Now know all men by these presents that I the said Thomas W. Hinnman for the purpose of securing and fulfilling the objects aforesaid and in consideration of the premises have bargained and sold and delivered and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto the said C. P. Sullivan, C. P. Jones, W. H. Early, John Charles, Joel Charles, Jacksdale Charles, Peter G. Charles, James McCallough, Edwin, Edwin Ware, Benjamin Arnold and Wesley Robertson the following Slaves to wit a man, Abu, Linda, a woman, Pinda a man, Tomah a woman, John a boy, Caroline and her Child, Anna a young woman, and little Caroline and her Child.

To have and to hold the aforesaid Slaves and their further increase unto the aforesaid attorneys and bail and their executors and administrators forever subject nevertheless to the following condition. First to secure the payment of my said attorneys fees and debt I know one some of them and up the secondly to indemnify and save harmless my said bail and whom their objects are accomplished and fulfilled this mortgage and deed of conveyance is to become void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
