(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) by Thomas C. Austin of the District
and State aforesaid, We have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these our
documents grant, bargain sell and release unto the said Thomas C. Austin, his
Heirs and assigns, all that tract or parcel of land known as the old Austin
and Davis tract, supposed to be two hundred acres
more or less, together with part of the old tract known as the Mill tract,
sold by Joseph Smith to C. J. Hall and Miller by said C. J. Hall to the
said Charles J. Hall, beginning at a Post Oak, thence W. N. E. corner to a
S. 10^o 50' rock to P. O. Then S. 10^o 40' across the creek to P. O., thence S. 70^o
E. to P. oak down, thence S. 10^o E. on cane line to Biddle Creek, thence along
the meanderings of said creek to a large rock on the north side of
creek, opposite to cane line, thence North or nearly so to a B. oak S.
C. & C. & C. then a west course or nearly so along the old Austin road
to where the Davis line crosses said road, thence N. 11^o W. to the beginning
corner together with all the rights, encroachments and appurtenances to the
said tract of land belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining thereto
I do hereby bind myself heirs executors administrators or assigns to maintain
and defend the said tract of land to the said T. C. Austin, his Heirs &c
against me my heirs Executors, administrators or assigns and every other person
