Deed South Carolina. Known all men by these pres-
ent that I Francis Wilson do make and seal this day of June 1853
and of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three
and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and fifty dollars
I give and grant unto my son Francis Wilson of said state and District of Columbia
all that tract or lot of land containing forty nine acres
more or less lying in said state and District of Columbia beginning at the mouth of
the house branch, thence up said branch 1780 to dogwood thence 490 to 780
1500 to 700 links to frost oak 1100 to white oak 1000 to 39 to Beach at the river
and down the river to the beginning with all and singular the rights, members
and appurtenances belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining
thereto and to hold all and singular the same premises unto the said William H.
Ashmore his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises unto the said William H. Ash-
more his heirs and assigns and against all and any other persons whomsoever claiming
the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 25th of June 1853
