Now this Indenture witnesseth That the said Alexander Greenfield by and in consideration of the said debts or sums payable as aforesaid and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Charles I Elford according to the three sealed notes aforesaid and also in consideration of the sum of Two dollars by the said Charles I Elford to him the said Alexander Greenfield in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents doth grant, sell, alien, release convey and confirm unto the said Charles I Elford and to his heirs and assigns forever all that piece of land aforesaid lying and being in the Town of Greenville and in the District and State aforesaid being on the West side of Richlawn Street bounded as follows being 103 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet all on Richlawn Street on the east aforesaid 350 feet on Samuels Mardian's lot on the North 103 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet on Vandy McBees land on the West end on back and 350 feet with Lots of Elford and Waddell on the South being the same conveyed to me by this day by Elford

Together with all and singular the rights, members and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversionary remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereunto.

To have and to hold the said Lot of Land with the appurtenances unto the said Charles I Elford his heirs and assigns forever.

I recd to always nevertheless and it is the true intent and meaning of the parties to these presents altho' if the said Alexander Greenfield shall Exectate or administer shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Charles I Elford the sum of One Thousand dollars together with all the interest that may accrue thereon according to the notes above mentioned then and from thence forth these presents shall be utterly null and void anything therein contained to the contrary being in any wise notwithstanding And it is covenanted and agreed upon between the parties to these presents that until default shall be made in payment of the aforesaid sum as before set forth and the interest for the same it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Alexander Greenfield peaceably and quietly to hold use occupy possess and enjoy
