consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and Thirty Eight Dollars Barton
to me in hand paid by Smallwood Dalton of the State and
District have bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant
and sell unto the said Smallwood Dalton my self
a certain piece of Land containing Sixty Eight and a half acres
acres be the same more or less situated in Greenville District 1836
and State aforesaid lying on the branches of Saluda River and the
such corners forms and marks us a plot thereunto annexed begining
on a Red Oak 3x0 thence West 5:85 to a B Oak thence 135° 62 to a N
375x8 thence S 30 W 19.80 to a P. Oak Station 33 chains and 20 Links
6015.80 to a pine 3x3 yds. thence N 72 E 20 to a Stake by the Garrison Road
thence S 77 E 11 to a stone on the Rail Road thence up the middle
of the said Road to a Stake thence N 20 W 3.41 to the beginning delivered
Bounded by Lands of the Westfield Dr W. Howell & Dr. A. and
and W. & A. Pain being a part of the Tea tract formerly owned by
the Westfield. Together with all and singular the Rights
members hereditaments appurtenances belonging or in any wise
incident appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the
said premises unto the said Smallwood Dalton his heirs and
assigns forever And I do hereby bind my self my heirs executors
Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular
the said premises unto said Smallwood Dalton his heirs executors
and administrators against myself my heirs and against
every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same
or any part thereof
