premises as far as the personal property is concerned and
this authority is to extend to any person whomsoever having
the said property in charge, and I do authorize the
administrator Comtestamento annex to reserve five dollars
to pay to Wm Mc Thomas out of this distribution share for his

of Westley Bates I deed the same in like manner
together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments
