 Sims of Greenville District in the State aforesaid have granted  
 bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant  
 bargain sell and release unto the said Daniel Sims all my  
 title interest & claim in & to a certain tract or parcel of land  
 situate lying and being in the said District and State containing  
 Two Hundred acres more or less on both sides of Jamison's  
 Mill Creek adjoining lands of William Turner and others  
 being a part of an original tract granted to William Gentry  
 and the same conveyed to me by D. Hooke Sheriff of said District  
 by Deed of June 16<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1856. Together with all and singular  
 the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the  
 said premises belonging or in anywise incident or apper-  
 taining, to have and to hold all and singular my interest  
 in the premises before mentioned unto the said Daniel Sims  
 his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind my  
 self my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and  
 forever defend all and singular my said interest in the said  
 premises unto the said Daniel Sims his heirs and assigns  
 against me and my heirs and every person or persons lawfully  
 claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof  
 Witness my hand and seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of September in the

 by said last will and testament aforesaid after having duly

 hath granted bargained sold and released and by these  
 presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
 John Groce his heirs and assigns all that piece parcel  
 or tract of land lying and being in the District and State  
 aforesaid on Clear Creek and Chelde's Beaver Dam  
 adjoining lands of William J. Gibson Carter Langley and  
 others containing One hundred and sixty five and one  
 fourth acres more or less and bounded by such lines as  
 the plat herewith attached and hereby made a part of  
 this deed fully represents together with all and singular  
 the hereditaments rights members and appurtenances what-  
 soever to the said premises belonging or any wise incident  
 or appertaining and the reversions and remainders rents  
 issues and profits dower possession property benefit claim  
 and demand whatsoever both at law and in equity of the  
 heirs and representatives of the said James Nolen deceased  
 and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the  
 same or any part thereof by from or under him or either of  
 them. To have and to hold the said piece parcel or tract  
 of land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances  
 unto the said John Groce his heirs and assigns forever
