of the sum of two hundred Dollars paid in hand to me by Richard Underwood granted bargained sold & released and and unto said Richard Underwood do grant bargain sell & release unto Richard Underwood this his heirs & assigns the one half of a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the State and District above said on the waters of Musch Creek Known as the John Boswell place containing 250 acres more or less bounded by lands F A Miles & A Nease and J L Childers and others it being the tract of land where I now live or Matilda Nix with. To gether with all and singular the rights and members hereditaments and appurtenances then unto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Richard Underwood and his heirs and assigns for ever against me and my heirs and Executors and administrators. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 10 of September 1862 signed sealed and delivered in presence of Francis Underwood George P Underwood

		late of Greenville District and State aforesaid, decd, in

his last will and testament directed that his Real Estate be divided into four lots that one lot belonging to his widow Lucy Bruce during her natural life and that the other three lots be sold by his Executors to the highest bidder. Now in conformity to said will the said land being divided into Lots No 1.2.3.4 as marked on plats representing the same after being duly advertised were sold at public outcry on the 16th day of November 1854 Lot No 1 for three hundred dollars Lot No 2 for one hundred and eighty five dollars Lot No 3 for two hundred Dollars in all six hundred and eighty five dollars and purchased by John McCarman he being the highest and last bidder. Now know all men by these presents that I George W Bruce of Greenville District and State aforesaid Executor of the Estate of Thomas Hardin Bruce decd for and in consideration of six hundred
