Fowler 52	Mortgage To of Me Crookwell	of the State of South Carolina Land	This Indenture made the sixth day of December in the year of our Lord our thousand Eight hundred and fifty five between John Mc Crotwell of the one part and America Fowler of the other part Witnesseth That the said John Mc Crotwell hath this day executed to the said Fowler his deed to a certain piece parcel or tract of land containing three hundred and forty acres more or less lying and being in the District of Greenville in the State aforesaid and bounded by lands of Andrew Elksa Elksa Brown and others, And where the said Fowler has executed two bonds payable as follows No 1 for Five hundred dollars in specie or its equivalent due the 25 th December AD 1866 and dated 6 th Decr 1865 with interest from date No 2 for One thousand Dollars in specie or its equivalent due 25 th Decr 1867 and dated December 6 th A.D 1865, with interest from date. Now this indenture witnesseth that the said Fowler for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid, and also to have the sum of Fifteen hundred Dollars to the said Crotwell promised to be paid by said Fowler in the said land Note specified have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Mc Crotwell all that piece parcel or tract of land above described together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Mc Crotwell his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators
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to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John Mc Crotwell his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Provided always nevertheless and it is the true intent and meaning of the parties to these presents that if the said America Fowler his heirs executors or administrators shall fail and be compelled to pay or cause to be paid unto the said John Mc Crotwell the sum of Fifteen Hundred dollars according to the terms of said bond & note above mentioned then and from thence forth these presents shall be utterly null and void. Anything herein contained to the contrary being in anywise notwithstanding. And it is
covenanted and agreed upon by and between the parties to these presents
that until default shall be made in payment of the aforesaid sum as before set forth
and the interest for the same it shall and may be lawful to and for the said John
America Fowler, peacefully and quietly to hold use occupy possess and enjoy
all and singular the premises above granted and released, and every part thereof
with the appurtenances, used to him service and take therefrom wages
and profits, being to his own particular use and behoof anything herein
contained to the contrary being in anywise notwithstanding.

Goodlett all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred acres in the same more or less situate and lying and being in the District and State aforesaid on both sides of River Brown beginning on a Pine on the North side of said River near the head of the Mill Pond thence S. 57 ^E to the river side chain to a Stake on Rd. Gilbreath's line at the corner of the Jackson Grove Camp Ground, thence N. 88 ⁴⁴ E. to a Stake, thence S. 7 ^E to a Stake, thence to a pine, thence S. 84 ^E , S. 6 ^E to a Red oak on Rd.
