I, John W. Ligon of Greenville District
in the State aforesaid in consideration of
fourteen hundred dollars in gold to me paid by James H.
Latimer of Upson County State of Georgia have granted
bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant
bargain sell and release unto the said James H. Latimer all
that piece parcel and lot of land containing three quarters
of an acre more or less situate lying and being on the south
side of Blenheim Street in the Town of Greenville and in
the District and State aforesaid having the following lines
borders and bounds, viz., beginning at an oak tree on Blenheim
Street Drayton corner thence N 38 W 119 feet to a corner of lot
formerly owned by Burgess House with said lot aforesaid come
161 feet to State St. thence thirty three feet to a slate on cross
street, thence with said cross street S 22 W 107 feet to a slate
St. Hells corner thence S 52 E 170 feet to a slate St. on Drayton
line and thence N 31 E along the Drayton line 214 1/2 feet to the
beginning the same lot which was conveyed to me by Isaac West
trustee of Mrs Emma LeClerc by deed bearing date 29th August
1865, together with all and singular the rights members headita-
ments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in
any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold
all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said
James H. Latimer his heirs and assigns forever and I do
hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to
warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises
unto the said James H. Latimer his heirs and assigns against
me and my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
Witness my hand and seal this the twenty first day of March
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty
six and in the 90th year of the Independence of the United
States of America " the words District in the state aforesaid and
State of South Carolina having been stricken out upon execution
said sealed and delivered in the presence of

This indenture made the first day of February
in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and fifty six between James
P. Moon Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for
Greenville District at Greenville Court House in the said State of the
one part and Laureal Dell Mary Dell and James Dell of the
other part, Whereas Prudence Dick widow of George Dell et al
on or about the eighteenth day of January in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and fifty six exhibited her bill of
complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the
said State against James Ross, et al, and the cause being at issue
before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Chambers in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six when
the said court after full hearing heard and mature deliberation
in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the real
estate of George Dell deceased in the Bill should be divided and
assigned amongst the parties in interest according to the division
and assignment recommended by the commissioners, and
whereas the commissioners in partition did assign to James
Dell Mary Dell and James Dell lot No 2 containing forty two
acres more or less, and valued at six hundred dollars. Now
therefore this indenture witnesseth that the said James P. Moon
as Commissioner of the said court under and by virtue of the said
decree and in consideration of the sum of three dollars paid him
by the said Laureal Dell Mary Dell and James Dell the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and
released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release
unto the said Laureal Dell Mary Dell and James Dell their heirs
and assigns all that tract or parcel of land situated in Greenville
District and State aforesaid on the north side of South Upper River
and on both sides of Wild Cat Creek beginning at a stone S 72
N 16 1/4 E 16 to stone S 74 N 38 W 28.50 across Wild Cat Creek
to stone S 74 N in hollow thence N 38 W 4.50 down south Upper
river to a point on river thence to a stone S 74 N 38 W 28.50
thence N 73 E 5.70 to the beginning corner and containing forty two
