five hundred dollars to me paid by Basil Manly Junior of the District of Greenville in the State of South Carolina have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Basil Manly Junior all those two pieces parcel and lots of land adjoining each other situate lying and being in the town of Greenville and State of South Carolina. And having the following lines, metes and descriptions. To wit the first lot beginning at a stake on Academy Street thirty feet from Sarah Baker's (or O'Leary's) corner and running along Academy Street 122 West three hundred and forty five feet to a stake near Wadley's place thence N 74 W two hundred and sixty four feet to a stake near the fence inside thence N 22 E four hundred and sixty eight and a half feet to a stake by the side of a road thence S 50 1/2 E two hundred and seventy three feet to the beginning supposed to contain about two and a half acres more or less the second lot beginning at or near a Post oak at the edge of ditch and running thence with the said ditch N 22 E ninety nine feet to a stake thence S 50 1/2 W ninety nine feet to a stake thence S 22 W ninety nine feet to a stake thence S 50 1/2 E ninety nine feet to the edge of said ditch by the approach Post oak to the beginning containing thirty poles of land more or less both said lots of land having heretofore been conveyed by Wadley's place to Thomas C Austin and by Thomas C Austin to Peter W Chick Trustee for Mrs Louisa V.
