This Indenture made the fifteenth day of
February, in the year of our Lord One
thousand eight hundred and fifty seven between Peter Cumble of the
one part and Henry Cumble of the other part Minnesotah;
Whereas, the said Peter Cumble is indebted to the said Henry A. Cumble
in the sum of One thousand seven hundred and eighty Dollars
and Eighty cents by his promissory Note under seal bearing even date
with this present.

Now thirdly witnesseth, that the said Peter Cumble for and in
consideration of the premises aforesaid, and also in consideration of the
sum of Sixty Dollars to the said Peter Cumble by the said Henry
Cumble in hand paid, is and before the sealing and delivering of these
present, gave granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents
do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said Henry A. Cumble all
that he or his assigns may be holding and being in the town of Greenville, on the corner
of Main and Coffey streets being Ninety Seven feet on Main Street and
Coffey Street two hundred and forty feet to Lawrence street, thereon
Ninety Seven feet on said street and thence two hundred and forty
feet to the beginning corner of Main street.

And, the within all and singular the Rights, Members, hereditaments and
appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident
or appertaining; to have and to hold, all and singular the premises
so far mentioned, unto the said Henry A. Cumble his Heirs, and Assigns
forever. And, I do hereby bind my Heirs Executors, and Administrators
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto
the said Henry A. Cumble his Heirs and Assigns against myself, and
my Sons, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or
claiming the same or any part thereof.

Provided always notwithstanding, and it is the true intent and meaning of the
parties to these presents, that if the said Peter Cumble his Heirs, Executors
or Administrators shall will and truly pay or cause to be paid unto
the said Henry A. Cumble the sum of One thousand, seven hundred
and Eighty dollars and Eighty cents according to the intent of the
provisionary Note above mentioned, then and upon that account, these presents
shall be utterly null and void; anything contained herein to the contrary
hereof in any wise notwithstanding. And it is covenanted and agreed upon
by and between the parties to these presents, that in case default shall be made
in payment of the abovesaid sum at before set forth, and the interest for
the same, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Peter Cumble
peaceably and quietly to hold, use, occupy possess and enjoy, all and
singular the premises above granted and released, and even part thereof
with the appurtenances, and to have, receive, and take the rents, issues and
profits thereof to his own particular use and behoof; anything herein con-
cerned to the contrary hereof in any wise notwithstanding.
