That I Isaac Wolf Justice for Mrs
E. C. Barn of Columbia in the State
of South Carolina
Aforesaid have in consideration of the
sum of Three hundred Dollars To me paid by George E. Elford
of Greenville in the State aforesaid have granted, bargained with
and released and by these presents do grant, bargain
set and release unto the said George E. Elford all that
lot or parcel of land situate lying and being in the town
of Greenville State aforesaid bounded by Brunswick Street
College Street and Brookes Avenue being four hundred
and forty feet on Brunswick, three hundred and sixty feet
on College Street, one hundred and fifty five feet on
Brooks Avenue, being part of a lot of land conveyed to
H. B. Duncan by J. A. Towne Esq. in Equity due date
the day of October 1837 previously conveyed by Nandy,
Mc Kee & Sonnleitner Esq. due date the 4 of December 1830
and subsequently conveyed to me as Justice for E. C. Barn by the
date 22nd May 1863 by H. B. Duncan the dates and boundaries
of which said lot of land will more accurately appear by reference
to said conveyance. Before these being held there to
gather with all and singular the rights members, inhabitants
and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in
anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all
and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said
George E. Elford his heirs and assigns forever and
do hereby bind myself as Justice and my successors in
office to warrant and forever defend all and singular
the said premises unto the said George E. Elford his
executors administrators, heirs and assigns against me
and my heirs and all other persons lawfully claiming
to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand
and seal this Eighteenth day of November in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty three
and in the ninety first year of the Independence of the
United States of America, signed, sealed and delivered
in the presence of the undersigned Executors and admi-
nistrators struck out before execution.

This indenture made the seventh day
of October in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and sixty seven between James P. Moore
commissioner of the court of Equity of the one part and Henry Gaunt
of the other party witnesseth wherefore the said Henry Gaunt stands
indebted to the said James P. Moore commissioner as aforesaid
by a certain bond of three hundred dollars dated 7 Oct 1867 now
this indenture witnesseth that the said Henry Gaunt for and in
consideration of the said debt or sum payable as aforesaid to the
said James P. Moore commissioner as aforesaid and for the better
securing the payment thereof to the said James P. Moore
commissioner as aforesaid according to the bond aforesaid and
also in consideration of the sum of three dollars by him the said
James P. Moore commissioner aforesaid to the said Henry Gaunt
to have paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these present
do grant, bargain sell, alien, release, convey and confirm unto the said
James P. Moore and to his successors in office forever all that
lot of land situated within the incorporated limits of the village
of Greenville District of Greenville State aforesaid containing three
acres more or less and better known as the John H. Smith Lot
and described in the return of the claims to the writ for the
admeasurement of clover for Mrs S. A. Elford as Lot No 1 and
as sold this day 6 and to sell this day 6 to do come in Equity
and unchanged to the said Henry Gaunt for three hundred dollars
together with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances
thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining and the same in and
pertaining thereto and remainders rents issues and profits
thereof to have and to hold the said lot of land with its appurtenances
unto the said James P. Moore and his successors in office forever
provided always nevertheless and it is the true intent and
meaning of the parties to the present that of the said Henry
Gaunt his heirs executors or administrators shall well and truly
pay or cause to be paid unto the said James P. Moore his successors
in office or assigns the sum of three hundred dollars one and
two years after date in the last two judgments according to the same
above mentioned them and from thenceforth these presents shall be
utterly null and void any thing herein contained to the contrary
thereof in any wise notwithstanding and it is covenanted
and agreed upon by and between the parties to these presents that
such default shall be made up by amount of the aforesaid
sums for before set forth time the interest for the same if due
and only be lawful to sue for the said Henry Gaunt
