

Jas P Moon Deed  
 To Son  
 Burnell Cox For Land  
 This indenture made the Twenty ninth  
 day of August in the year of our Lord  
 One thousand eight hundred and sixty seven  
 between James P Moon Esquror Commissioner of the Honorable Court  
 of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House in the said  
 State of the one part and Burnell Cox of the other part. Whereas wherein  
 McCoy et al on or about the twentieth day of November in the year  
 of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty six exhibited their  
 Bill of complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in  
 the said State against Burnell Cox et al. and the cause being at  
 issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Chambers in the  
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven when the  
 said Court after full hearing King and Molen deliberation in the  
 premises did order adjudge and decree that the tract of land described  
 in the pleadings containing four hundred and seventy two acres be  
 vested in fee in the said Burnell Cox by the Commissioners of the  
 said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the Decree  
 order as by reference thereto in the Registry of the said Court will  
 appear and the said James P Moon as Commissioner of the said  
 Court in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven  
 did vest the Land below described unto the said Burnell Cox for the  
 sum of Four Thousand four hundred Dollars. Now whereas this  
 indenture witnesseth that the said James P Moon as Commissioner  
 of the said Court under and by virtue of the said Decree and in considera-  
 tion of the sum of Four Dollars paid him by the said Burnell  
 Cox the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained  
 sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain  
 sell and release unto the said Burnell Cox his heirs and assigns  
 all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in  
 the District and State aforesaid on water of Musch Creek adjoing  
 lands of Washington Nichols James Jackson Edward Turner  
 Cleburne Hammett & others containing Four Hundred and  
 Seventy two acres more or less as represented by a plot  
 made by James T. Dicklow on the 27 March 1866  
 together with all and singular the credits and Rights  
 known and Appertaining whatsoever to the said Land  
 belonging or in anywise appertaining and the various  
 and remainder Rents, Dues and Profits there of and  
 also all the Estate Right Title Interest Power Description  
 Property Benefit Claims and Demand whatsoever  
 at Law and in Equity of the Heirs and Representa-  
 tives of the said Passilla Cox Dicklow and of  
 the parties to this first and of all other persons right-  
 fully claiming on the claims the same or any part  
 thereof by force or under them or either of them to  
 have and to hold the said Land with its appendants  
 Befallings and Appurtenances unto the said Burnell  
 Cox his Heirs and Assigns to his and their prop-  
 erty and use of forever

 Whereas the above bound William A. McDaniel hath been elected to the  
 office of Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions for  
 the County of Greenville. Now the condition of the above obligation  
 is such that if the above bound William A. McDaniel shall well and  
 truly perform the duties of the said office as now or hereafter  
 required by law during the whole period he may continue in said  
 office then the above obligation to be void and of no effect or else  
 to remain in full force and virtue
