Gray of the County of Charleston in the Said State Special Refree sends greeting Whereas Edward E. Earle Administrator of James T. Earle died on or about the fifteenth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty eight did execute her Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity at Charleston in the County of Charleston and State aforesaid against Mary Earle Edward Earle Julia Earle and Steven B. Earle Minors Hawkins Weston H. H. DeLoos Martha R. Singletree Thomas O'Brien Samuel B. Toly and John Margrood in which among other matters it was prayed that the Real Estate of the late James T. Earle be sold for the purpose of paying his debts settling his estate and for other and further relief of Commo. Please our the Equity side and the cause being at issue before the Board called Court Court to be held at the town of Greenville and eight
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hundred and Seventy where the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did orderly judge and decree that the premises more particularly herein after set forth and described should be sold by the Said Refree of said County on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the several orders and decree final in the said made all of which will more fully appear on reference to the office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of the said County of Charleston A. Gray Special Refree after having duly advertised the said premises for sale at public outcry on the seventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy did there openly and publicly and after the manner of sections five the said premises to Alexander Payne for the sum of one thousand and ninety nine Dollars he being at that price the highest bidder for the said land now to now that I, the said James W. Gray of the said County Special Refree in consideration of the premises and also in consideration of the said sum of one thousand and ninety nine dollars paid me by the said Alexander Payne the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Alexander Payne and his heirs and assigns all that tract of land situate in Greenville County and State aforesaid about three miles from Greenville Court House on the right hand side of the Pendleton Road Measuring and containing one hundred nine (109) acres more or less and fully described in a plat by John Watson dated 4th December 1855 Together with all and singular the hereditaments Rights Members and Appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging or in anywise appertaining and the resources and remainderies unto issues and profits thereof And also the estate right title interest down possession property bought claim and demand whatsoever both at law and in Equity of the said Defendants and of all the parties to the said suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof by force or under them or either of them to have and to hold the said premises with its hereditaments privilages and appurtenances unto the said Alexander Payne his heirs and assigns to his and their own proper use benefit and behoof forever And witness whereof I the said James W.
