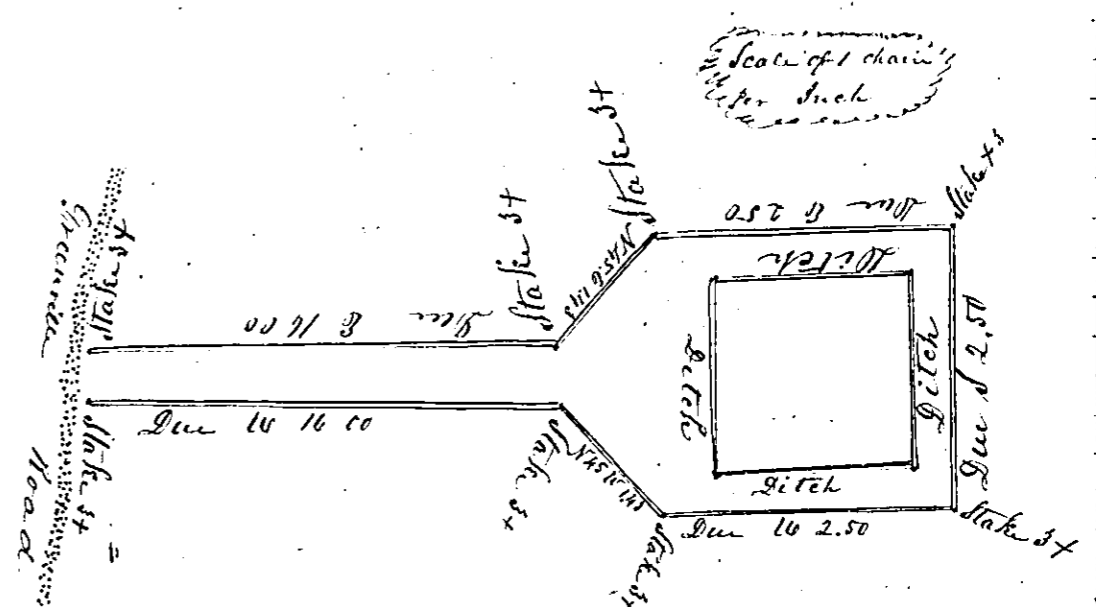


James McCullough, Deed, State of South Carolina, Greenville County.  
 We, J. McCullough, known all men by their presents, that James McCullough of said state and County, does hereby convey, mortgage, lease, bargain, sell, grant and release and assign to the McCullough family the descendants of Joseph McCullough, deceased, all that plat of land situated in the county aforesaid on the west of the Greenville Road, with the drift of way from the said Greenville Road, said plat of land containing one acre more or less which is more fully represented by a plat hereunto annexed, said plat of land to be known as the McCullough Burying Ground on family cemetery and to be free to the said McCullough family descendants of Joseph McCullough deceased forever and the said James McCullough do hereby give, devise, bequeath, assign, transfer and defend the title of said plat of land into the said McCulloughs for the uses and purposes before mentioned as a family burying ground free from all claims of any person or persons whatsoever other than the said McCullough family. In witness whereof, I have assigned my name and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and seventy and twenty fourth year of America's Independence signed sealed and delivered in presence of

 This Friday the first day of January in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy between William A. McDaniel Esquire Clerk of the Court for Greenville County at Greenville Court House in the said state of the one part and James P. Boyce Treasurer S. P. Theological Seminary of the other part witnesseth whereas the said James P. Boyce Treasurer as aforesaid is indebted to the said William A. McDaniel Esquire Clerk as aforesaid by Bond conditions for the payment of Six thousand Dollars in one and two years after date with interest from date in equal annual installments now the indentures witnesseth that the said James P. Boyce Treasurer as aforesaid for and in consideration of the said debt or sum payable as aforesaid to the said William A. McDaniel
