 Know all men by these presents  
 that I Thomas Hopkins of the said  
 State and County aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Six  
 Hundred and Seventy four Dollars and forty one cents to me  
 paid by Hewlett Sullivan of the said State and County aforesaid  
 have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents  
 do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Hewlett  
 Sullivan a tract of One Hundred and twenty two and a half  
 acres of Land more or less, situated lying and being in the  
 County of Greenville and State aforesaid on the head branches  
 of the South Reedy Fork of Reedy River and being composed of  
 two tracts adjoining each other, One containing One hundred  
 and three and a half acres, bounded as follows, Beginning  
 at a white oak 3/4 thence N 45 50 ch to a Hickory 3/4 thence S 85 50  
 ch to a white oak 3/4 thence N 5 50 ch to a stake 3/4 thence N 85  
 W 21 50 ch to the beginning corner. The other tract contains  
 Nineteen acres and is bounded as follows Beginning at a stake  
 3/4 N 5 50 ch to a stake 3/4 thence N 63. W 10. ch to a pine 3/4  
 thence N 61 25 ch to the beginning corner Both tracts containing  
 One Hundred and twenty two and a half acres more or less, and  
 bounded by lands of the same Moon for a Chaudler & Estate of  
 Drury Hopkins deed and the land whereon the late Artemus  
 H. Smith lived. Together with all and singular the rights, mem-
