And it is covenanted and agreed upon by and between the parties to these presents that interest default shall be made in payment of the aforesaid sum as before set forth and the interest for the same to share and may be lawful for and for the said Samuel Stradley personally and jointly to hold me occupy possess and enjoy the said premises the premises above granted and which every part thereof
