R. Hightower & Morgan Polly Edmonfield and the Evaline Ward. Together with all and singular the rights Membrus Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Evaline Ward her heirs and assigns for Aed I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Evaline Ward her heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witness my hand and seal this 23rd day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one and in the ninth year of the Independence of the United States of America
