Whereas Grady and

 Kauffman of Greenville County in the State of South Carolina
 were on the day of August A.D. 1869 adjudicated
 Bankrupt upon the petition of the assignees in
 Bankruptcy of John W. Grady Bankrupt in the
 District Court of the United States for the District
 of South Carolina in accordance with the
 provisions of an act of Congress entitled an
 act to establish a uniform system of bankruptcy
 throughout the United States approved March
 2 1867. And whereas on the day of A.D. 1869 the
 day appointed for the meeting of the creditors of
 said Bankrupt the undersigned were duly
 appointed assignees of the estate of the said
 Bankrupt by J. S. Clawson Esq one of the
 Registers in Bankruptcy of said Court to
 whom the adjudication was referred by Hon.
 George S. Bryan Judge of the said Court and
 whereas the said J. S. Clawson Register
 thereupon assigning to them the whole of
 the Real Estate thereupon assigned to them
 and Personal Estate of the said Grady and
 Kauffman Bankrupts and whereas upon the
 application of the undersigned leave was
 granted to them to sell all the Real Personal
 Estate of the said Bankrupts and whereas
 after duly advertising for twenty one days
