Troyham while they or either of them shall live they are to have the Liberty of using any timber they may need from any of the Land while they live and the free use of the Buildings the said Parties before named leaving the Land to pay all Taxes on said Land during the lifetime of said Leemann and Troyham and at the death of the said Leemann & Elizabeth Troyham the Lot No 2 mentioned before to be Equally divided between the parties to this Bond and after the death of the said Leemann and Elizabeth Troyham the deeds executed for said Land having date with this Bond shall then vest in the Parties according to the terms expressed and should either party before named violate this Bond the deeds before mentioned shall even determine and be void otherwise to be in full force and virtue the witnesses whereof we the Parties before mentioned viz Oliver Troyham Jos.
