Trammell of Greenville County in the aforesaid State have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant Bargain sell and release unto the said Jefferson B. Trammell a certain tract piece or parcel of land lying and being situated in Greenville County and State aforesaid on some small branches flowing of South Tyger River known as part of the Durham Tract and the B. W. Southland land and runs as follows Beginning on a Spanish oak stump 3^t thence N 67° E 6.67 chains to a Stake or Malinda Hollings 3^t thence N 84 1/3 W 49.80 chains to a Stake or 3^t thence S 10 2/3 W 20.00 chains to a small Hickory 3^t thence S 84 1/3 E 47.00 chains to a Stake or thence S 12° E 10.18 chains to a Stake or thence S 31° E 5.80 chains to an oak stump 3^t thence S 36 1/2 E 8.75 chains to a Holly 3^t thence S 22 1/2 E 4.80 chains to a dead W.
