 of Greenville County, in the State aforesaid, my consideration  
 of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000) to my said self, Samuel  
 Stradley of Greenville County in the State aforesaid  
 have granted bargained sold and released, and by these  
 presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the  
 said Thomas Stradley, all that certain piece of land  
 and lot of land containing one acre more or less, situate  
 lying and being in the said County and State in the  
 town of Greenville, in the  
 presence of John Carpenter and having the follow-  
 ing lines and boundaries to wit: Beginning at a point  
 on the Rail Road at the corner and running thence  
 to a stone 33' from the corner.  
 Hence along the street in front of the old May Klay's store  
 11' 13" 6" to a Stake, thence 25' 6" to 30' 8" ft. 3" to a  
 Stake on the right of way of the C. & P. Rail Roads  
 hence along said right of way to the Beginning  
 together with all and singular the rights, members,  
 appurtenances and appendencies to the said premises  
 belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining  
 to have and to hold all and singular the premises before  
 mentioned, unto the said Samuel Stradley, his heirs  
 and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind me my heirs  
 executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend  
 all and singular the said premises, unto the said Samuel
