Robertson County Auditor as aforesaid do hereby bind the State of South Carolina to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Jacob Smith his heirs and assigns against the said State of South Carolina, and against every person and all persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or claim the same or any part thereof.
