Know all men by these presents that I  
 Manly Bright  
 James Wilson of Greenville County in the aforesaid state in  
 consideration of Two hundred and twenty five Dollars to  
 me in hand paid by Manly Bright of Greenville County  
 in the state aforesaid have granted bargained sold and  
 released and by these presents do grant bargain sell  
 and release unto the said Manly Bright a certain  
 piece or parcel of Land situated in Greenville County and  
 State aforesaid containing Fifty Seven Acres more or less  
 lying on Branch waters of South Tyger River and water  
 of proham's Creek it being a part of the homestead of  
 James Wilson commencing at a persimmon on the East side  
 of the Mountain Road running Strait to a Red Oak on the  
 West side of the Manly Branch &c thence bounded by lines  
 of G. W. Mestron and John Duncanson and Manly Bright  
 together with all and singular the rights members and hereditaments  
 and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise  
 incident or appertaining, To have and to hold all and singu-  
 lar the premises before mentioned unto the said Manly  
 Bright his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby  
 bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to  
 warrant and forever defend all and singular the said  
 premises unto the said Manly Bright his heirs and assigns  
 against me and my heirs and against every other  
 person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the  
 same or any part thereof
