 ty as is exempt from the operations of this assignment, by the  
 provisions of the said fourteenth section of said act;  
 To have and to hold, all the foregoing premises to the said W H  
 Shumate his heirs forever. In trust, nevertheless, for the  
 use and purposes, with the powers, and subject to the conditions  
 and limitations set forth in said act.
