Lawson, one of the Registers in Bankruptcy of said Court, by virtue of the authority vested in me, by the fourteenth section of the act of Congress entitled "an act to establish a uniform system of Bankruptcy throughout the United States" approved March 2, 1867 do hereby convey and assign to the said W. J. Shumate Assignee as aforesaid, all the estate, real and personal, of the said J. Le Heitch Bankrupt aforesaid, including all the property of whatever kind, of which he was possessed, or in which he was interested or entitled to have, on the 19 day of February, 1877, with all his deeds, Books and papers relating thereto. Excepting such property as is exempted from the operation of this assignment, by the provisions of the said fourteenth section of said act. To have and to hold, all the foregoing premises to the said W. J. Shumate his heirs forever, In trust nevertheless for the use and purposes, with the powers, and subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in said act.
