Release

The State of South Carolina
Whereas John H Williams of
Newberry County in the state
aforesaid, did, on the twenty

sixth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and fifty eight, execute a warranty title to a tract of
land in Abbeville District (now County) containing two thous-
and and fifty seven acres more or less to James W Williams
in trust for the sole use and benefit of Eliza F Williams
now Eliza F Quist, Martha E Williams and William A Williams,
grandchildren of said John H Williams, for and during their
natural lives and then in trust for their issue respectively, with
survivorship among them in case of the death of either of
said cestui que trust without issue, and with survivorship over
to said James W Williams, his brother Robert G Williams
and his sisters Elizabeth H Williams and Theresa O Williams in
case of the death of all of the first mentioned cestui que trust
without issue. And whereas the said James W Williams, Trustee,
under a power contained in said deed, sold and conveyed
said tract of land to one James B Richardson and failed to
collect all of the purchase money therefor. And whereas the
said first mentioned cestui que trust, who were minors, did
afterwards, by their mother and next friend Mrs. Kitty H Williams,
exhibit their Bill in Equity for account, Relief &c, in
the Circuit Court for Newberry County in said state, against
the said James W Williams, Trustee, and the action therein
was compromised, and paid compromise was confirmed by
order of said court. And whereas the said John H Williams
in consideration of said compromise, and upon the express
condition that said first mentioned cestui que trust nor
either should ever institute and proceedings to set aside said
compromise, conveyed to said James W Williams, Trustee,
a certain other tract of land situate in Newberry County
South Carolina on Mills Creek, containing Six hundred
and six acres more or less and known as the Burgess place
upon the same trusts and subject to the same limitations and
conditions as contained in the deed of first above named. And
whereas the said cestui que trust, Martha E Williams and
the remaindermen, Elizabeth H Williams and Theresa O
Williams have died unmated and without issue.
