

Mary & Greenfield and Jay B. Now know all men, that I the said S J Douthit Probate Judge as aforesaid in consideration of the premises, and also in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and ten dollars paid me by the said Francis C Sherman the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Francis C Sherman and her heirs and assigns, all that tract of land, situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid adjoining lands of Dr W R Jones, John Banister and others, beginning at a stone 3 x 3 x m m Thence S 12 1/3 W 31 to a pile of stones 3 x 3 x m m Thence S 56 1/4 E 12 04 to a Post Oak 3 x 3 x 3 x m m Thence N 12 1/3 E 35 30 to a stone 3 x 3 x m m Thence N 77 1/3 W 1 1/2 to the beginning corner and containing thirty six acres more or less together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever, to the said tract of land belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the revenues and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, and also all the estate, right title interest, power, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said Jacob Shaver deceased and of all the parties to the said suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, by, from or under them, or either of them. To have and to hold the said tract of land with its hereditaments, privileges and appurtenances unto the said Francis C Sherman her heirs and assigns forever.
