Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises, belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold, all and singular the said premises, unto the said David S McCullough and his successors forever, subject nevertheless to the same trust limitations, provisos and restrictions, as are imposed, in a Deed of Conveyance executed and delivered, by the said James McCullough, to the said David S McCullough Trustee of 26th day of March A.D. 1875, and recorded in the Register of Deed Conveyance office in and for the County of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, in Book G.G. page 291 92 93 and I do hereby bind myself, my heirs executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular the said premises, unto the said David S McCullough trustee as aforesaid, and his successors, against me and my heirs and assigns, and against every other person, whosoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof.
