Now know all men by these presents, that I, the said Mary A. Stansell for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to me in hand paid by the said George W. Anderson and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and for divers other considerations more fully mentioned have granted, bargained, sold, surrendered and yielded and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, surrender and yield up unto the said George W. Anderson his executors, administrators and assigns to never the said buildings above mentioned, and all the estate right title interest term property claim and demand whatsoever which I have of in or to the same or any part thereof. To have and to hold the same unto the said George W. Anderson his executors, administrators and assigns to his and their duly proper use and behoof forever.
