in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of  
Five hundred and fifty one Dollars to us paid by N. J. Roman  
of the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid, have  
granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said N. J. Roman  
his heirs all that certain tract portion or parcel of land  
situated lying and being in the above written State and County  
on both sides of the Saluda Gap Road on the waters of Thompsons  
Beaver Dam creek and known as lot number one on a plat  
made by J. C. Williamson surveyor for the heirs of William  
Roman deed August 28<sup>th</sup> 1880. The same being a portion of the  
home tract of said William Roman deed beginning at a  
Sourwood corner between Moss Runmen and E. Few and  
running with Few line N 66° 13' 55" to a stone 37 then N 53  
E 1° 18' 00" to a stake on South side of Saluda Gap Road thence  
N 13 E 11.67 to a stake thence N 69 E 4° 50" to a stone 37 thence  
S 24 E 12.00 to a stone 37 thence S 58 W 37.85 to the beg-  
inning corner containing Eighty Acres more or less  
bounded by lands of E. Few and late No 2ms two and three  
as shown by the above described Plat Together with  
all and singular the rights liberties hereditaments and appur-  
tenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise
