Know all men by these presents

that I William Raneys of Greenville

County in the State aforesaid,

in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars

to be paid by me to the State of South Carolina

and for other good and sufficient cause

the said Raymon Davidson a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid on branches of Langston's Creek of Reedy Run it being part of a tract of land originally granted to Joseph Langston (and being part of the tract wherein A. L. Nealy lived in the year 1859). Beginning at a stone 3x by a large Black Oak tree \$20 W 18.60 to a stone 3x thence \$60 E 3.25 to a stone 3x thence 8 2 1/4 W 2.5.6 to a stone 3x thence N 83 1/2 W 7.37 to a Red oak 3x 3x thence N 83 1/4 W 3.07 to a stone 3x thence S 62 1/2 W 5.33 to a Pine 3x 3x thence N 77 1/4 W 7.10 to a stone 3x thence N 41 1/4 E 12.28 to a stone 3x by a Pine 3x thence N 61 1/2 E 2.1.10 to the beginning containing twenty five and one fourth acres more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said Raymon Davidson his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Raymon Davidson his heirs and assigns against one and my heirs, & every other person whosoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
