anywise concern. S. J. Douthick Master of the County of Greenville in the said State send greeting: Whereas Michael B. Harrison on or about the 21st day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine did exhibit his complaint in the Court of Common Pleas in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid against James H. Harrison, William Harrison, Wade H. Harrison, Thomas G. Harrison, Ida Mauldin, Anna M. Harrison and others. And the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court aforesaid came on to be heard on the twenty first day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine when the said Court after a full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order, adjudge and decree that the tract of land belonging to the estate of Nancy Harrison deceased hereinafter mentioned and described should be sold at public auction by the Master of Greenville County on the terms and for the purpose mentioned in said decretal order and by reference thereto on file in the said Court, well appear; and the said Master after having duly advertised the said tract of land for twenty one days for sale by public outcry on the fifth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty did then openly and publicly and according to the custom of auction sell and dispose of the said tract of land below described unto J. A. Davenport for Ninety five Dollars he being at that price the highest bidder for the same. Now know all men that I the said S. J. Douthick Master as aforesaid in consideration of the premises and also in consideration of the sum of Ninety five Dollars paid me by the said J. A. Davenport the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold released and by these presents do grant bargain

and assigne all that tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid adjoining lands of Mrs. Gray Mrs. Lovelock and others on waters of Horse Creek beginning at a corner on said Creek thence N 20 E 4.50 to a stone 3 x 0.2 m thence N 87 1/2 E 22.15 a stone 3 x 0.2 m thence S 87 1/4 W 12.80 to a stone 3 x 0.2 m on said Creek thence up the meanders of said Creek to the beginning corner and containing Nineteen and fourth acres more or less Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Tract of land belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversions and remainders rents issues and profits thereof and also all the estate right title interest Dower possession property benefit claim and demands whatsoever both at law and in equity of the said Nancy Harrison deceased and of all the parties to the said suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof by force or under them or either of them To have and to hold the said Tract of land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances unto the said J.
