I now call upon my said presents, that I, Abraham Cannon of Greenville County, in the State of South Carolina, in consideration of the sum of Three hundred Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealings of these presents by Rodolphus Burns of Greenville County in the State of South Carolina (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold and released, unto the said Rodolphus Burns, a certain piece, parcel or tract of land containing Sixty five acres, with the same more or less, situated in Greenville County and State aforesaid on the banks of Saluda River, and adjoining lands of William West, William Gust, and Mary Bates, together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Rodolphus Burns his heirs and assigns forever, And I do hereby give my self, my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Rodolphus Burns his heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and every other person or persons lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof.
