and her husband Henry E. Cox, a Bill of Com-

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John Cox, in his own right and as administrat-
or of Thomas M. Cox deceased, and Thomas M.
Cox, demand and judgment in relation to the
property herein after mentioned and described
and the same being so issued, came out to be
signed on the 14th day of July 1883 and such
proceedings were had as resulted in a Decree of
the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and
decreed, that the interest of the late Thomas M.
Cox deceased in the lot and building now used
in conducting, and carrying on the shipman-
ship business, and in consideration the stock
in trade, of every description of the late firm of
Cox & Martley be vested in the Plaintiff Henry

title to said interest of said Thomas M. Cox deceased
in said partnership property to the said Henry C
Martley, how, therefore I now all my self thereto
present, that I doth remaster as aforesaid
by virtue of said decree, and in consideration
of the sum of ten dollars to me paid by the
said Henry C. Martley, the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged, How granted, bargained
sold, and released, and by this present Deed grant
bargain sell and release unto the said Henry
C. Martley, all that lot of land situate lying
and being in the City and County of Greenville
and State aforesaid; Beginning at a hole in rock
on the West side of main street and running up
said street N 19° E 195 feet to brick ^{corner} then at
N 73° W 196 1/4 feet to rock near corner of Block
No. 11 shop there N 71° W 196 1/4 feet to corner
and so continued this to corner back and brick
