in this, a cause in this case, singular in the
spirit of conciliation, the said Captain M. C. Bain
of the U. S. Army, as a sign of favor, and I do hereby
represent the said Captain as under the said Captain
for his, for him this cause and cause forever a
gentleman and a good man, and his son a
honest and upright young man who has been
fairly claiming, as he claims the same or any
part thereof.
