care of us and to minister to our wants, and to take care of
the property which we own, I wish that after we are
dead, and our bodies decently buried, and all our expe-
nses connected with the same and all lawful debts paid
that the said Dyer Campbell should have, to do here by
in this my last will and testament give to him the said
Dyer Campbell all of the property now owned both real
estate and personal, consisting of one hundred and twenty
two acres of land more or less, cattle, hogs, furniture, beds
bedding, in short every thing down in the house and out
