John E. Hightower The State of South Carolina  
To Release. Whereas Charlotte Holcomb late of Greenville  
James B. Humphreys County in the State aforesaid did on the twenty  
eighth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and seventy five execute a certain instrument in  
writing whereby she conveyed, or attempted to convey to her  
son David Hightower a certain tract of land situated lying  
and being in said state and county adjoining lands now  
or formerly of Estate of Humphreys Estate of William Hightower  
deceased and others being the tract of land wherein  
the said Charlotte Holcomb then lived upon condition  
that the said Daniel Hightower would take charge  
of said land lay her the rent thereof during her  
lifetime and within the years after her death

should pay to certain of her other children in said instrument mentioned certain sums of money therein specified  
and whereas there was a provision in said instrument to  
the effect that in case the said Daniel Hightower failed  
or refused to take said land upon the terms therein mentioned  
(the time for the payment of the said monies being  
limited to three years after the death of said Charlotte  
Holcomb) then the said land was to return to her estate  
and any other of her sons was to have the same upon making  
said payments, and whereas the said Daniel Hightower failed  
to take said land and the said Charlotte Holcomb afterwards  
executed her last will and testament whereby she  
directed said real estate to be sold by her executor and  
disposed of the proceeds, said last will and testament  
having been duly proven and said land has been  
sold by said executor and purchased by William C.  
Humphreys who has resold the same to James B. Humphreys  
and whereas the undersigned John E. Hightower is one of  
the sons of the said Charlotte Holcomb desires to renounce  
all interest in said land derived by through or from  
said instrument of writing which is recorded in  
book 4 G. page 613 of the office of the Register of Deeds  
conveyance for Greenville County. Now therefore know  
all men by these presents that I the said John E. Hightower  
in consideration of the premises and of one  
dollar to me paid by the said James B. Humphreys  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have  
renounced, released and forever relinquished and  
do hereby renounce, release and forever relinquish  
unto the said James B. Humphreys his heirs and  
assigns forever all of my right title interest and  
estate of m wts to all and singular the tract of land  
above mentioned and described. It is my land
