Gibson, deceased, Three Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Warren Gibson (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold, and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Warren Gibson the home tract of land containing One hundred and fifteen Acres, more or less, and bounded as follows, commencing at a stone on the Branch N. 66 E. 50.00 to Spanish C. thence N. 37 E. 26.50 to Stone, S. 72 1/2 E. 9.75 to a stone, thence S. 80 E. 8.80 to Hickory on branch thence N. 21 1/2 W. 14.50 to N. O. thence N. 6 E. 14.20 to Chestnut S. 75 W. 8.40 to stone, thence N. 29 W. 14.00 to Bush thence S. 71 W. 4.75 to stone, thence S. 23 1/2 W. 25.90 to stone, thence S. 68 E. 75 links to stone, thence S. 29 W. 8.80 to stone, thence S. 67 W. to stone on the branch, thence down the branch to the beginning, saving and reserving to myself however the right to occupy, use and employ the Eighth and three fourths of an acre (3 3/4) upon which the house is situated during the term of my natural life, which said eighth & three fourths of an acre are more fully described in a plat made by W. H. Hunt on the 26th day of February 1886. (Also another tract beginning at a stone on Armstrong Creek thence S. 72 E. 23.25 to N. O. thence N. 15 W. 12.20 to a stone thence N. 48 1/2 E. 7.50 to Bush on Armstrong Creek thence down the creek to the beginning, containing 34 3/4 acres, more or less. Also another piece of land beginning at the mouth of a ditch thence up the ditch to the head of ditch to a Postion thence S. 74 1/4 W. 2.00 to stake, thence N. 42 W. 1.00 to a stone thence S. 88 W. 2.14 to stone, thence S. 85 W. 2.00 to stone, thence S. 53 1/2 W. 2.65 to stone on the ditch, thence down the ditch to the River, thence down the River to stakes between the Warren Gibson, thence S. 87 E. 5.10 to a stone on the branch, thence down the branch to the beginning.

And I do hereby bind myself and my Heirs, Executors and Administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Warren Gibson his Heirs and assigns against me and my Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof.
