Do I Deed.

The State of South Carolina,  
Know all men by these Presents,  
that I, Bennett W. Holland of  
Greenville County in the State aforesaid, in consid-  
eration of the sum of Thirty-five Hundred Dollars  
to me in hand paid at and before the sealing  
of these presents, by Edgar J. Kemp of Greenville, Greenville County, State aforesaid, (the receipt whereof is hereby  
acknowledged,) have granted, bargained sold and  
released and by these presents do grant bargain,  
sell and release unto the said Edgar J. Kemp  
all of my undivided half interest in that certain  
piece, parcel, and tract of land situate, lying and  
being in the Counties of Greenville and Pickens,  
on both sides of Saluda River and known as  
the Davis Mill Place, containing two hundred  
and sixty acres, more or less. It being the same  
tract of land conveyed to George Westmonland  
and Edgar J. Kemp on the first day of October 1883  
by J. J. Lewis, Clerk of Court of aforesaid Pickens  
County, and one half interest was deeded to me  
by said Geo. Westmonland on the twenty-fifth of  
October 1884. Deed recorded in P. M. C. office Book  
P. O. page 872. Together with all and singular  
the Rights, Members, Inhereditaments and appur-  
tenances to the said Premises belonging, or in any  
wise incident or appertaining, to have and  
to hold, all and singular the said premises before  
mentioned, unto the said Edgar J. Kemp his Heirs  
and Assigns forever. And I do hereby bind my-  
self, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators, to  
warrant and forever defend all and singular  
the said premises unto the said Edgar J. Kemp  
and his Heirs and Assigns aforesaid and my  
Heirs, and against every person whomsoever  
lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or  
any part thereof, witness my hand and seal  
this sixth day of October in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five  
and in the one hundred and tenth year of the  
Sovereignty and Independence of the United  
States of America.
