

Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Edward
 T. Stokes and Araminta V. Westfield demanding
 judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter
 and described; and the cause being at issue
 came on to be heard on the 22^d day of July, 1886,

 edged, Have granted, bargained, sold and
 released, and by these presents do grant, bar-
 gain, sell and release unto the said Thomas
 Q. Donaldson, all that lot or parcel of land
 situate, lying and being in the City and
 County of Greenville and State aforesaid
 Beginning at a corner on Hudson Street and
 running thence with Oscar Street S. 57 1/2 E. 272 1/2
 feet to Mayberry Street, thence with Mayberry
 Street S. 15 1/2 W. 101 1/2 feet to a corner on lot No. 16, thence
 with the line of lot No. 16 N. 57 1/2 W. 276 feet to said
