

Georgia H. Purpin et al. The State of South Carolina  
 Esq. Power of Attorney Whereas, one William P.  
 S. M. Green et al. Purpin, who died in about  
 the year 1856, in the town of Greenville and State  
 of one said, left a last will and testament which  
 was duly admitted to probate in the then District  
 of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, on the 26<sup>th</sup>  
 day of March 1856, and whereas in said last  
 will and testament the said William P. Purpin  
 devised his house and lot known at the time  
 of the making of his said last will and testa-  
 ment which is dated 4<sup>th</sup> day 1842, as number  
 416 Broome Street in the City and State of New  
 York and also his other house and lot known  
 as number 186 Elm Street in the said City and  
 State of New York and all his other freehold-  
 estates whatsoever and wheresoever the same  
 might be, to certain Trustees in trust for his  
 wife Louisa Purpin who afterwards intermar-  
 ried with one Thomas C. Markley for and dur-  
 ing the term of her natural life and after her  
 death in trust for his child or children by her  
 living at the time of her death and if none then  
 in trust for the use and behoof of his right  
 heirs and their assigns as will more fully  
 appear by reference to said will and Whereas  
 the said Louisa Markley, formerly Purpin the  
 widow of said William P. Purpin died on the  
 third day of July, A. D. 1886, in the City of Greenville  
 State of South Carolina leaving no children  
 her surviving, nor the child or children of any  
 deceased child or children. Now therefore know  
 all men by these presents, that we Georgia H. Purpin  
 widow of J. M. A. Purpin, Mary E. Purpin wife of  
 J. B. E. Purpin, and Anna M. Purpin, wife of Thomas  
 J. Purpin, the widow and co-wives of the above named  
 heirs of the said William P. Purpin deceased, all  
 of the State of South Carolina have made, con-  
 stituted and appointed and by these presents do  
 make, constitute and appoint Samuel M. Green,  
 Dr. E. J. Rowley and W. J. Parrant of the said  
 State of South Carolina, our true and lawful
