Come, I Samuel J. Dauthick, Master in and for the County
aforesaid, send Greeting, Whereas in a certain pro-
ceeding supplementary to execution had in the
Circuit Court for the County of Greenville and
State aforesaid, between the United States Carriage
Company as plaintiff, and S. W. Rodgers & Co. as
plaintiff and also Alonzo C. Ladd as Plaintiff
against Gilreath, Harris & Co. defendants, the cause
being at issue, came on to be heard on the 21st
day of July 1886, and such proceedings were
had therein as resulted in an order or decree
of the Court whereby it was adjudged and de-
creed that the premises or property hereinafter
mentioned and described be sold by S. J. Dauthick

presents do grant, convey, sell and release
unto the said Geo. Westmoreland as Trustee his
heirs and assigns, all of the right title interest
and estate which legal owners hold which

have, either as individuals or as partners under the
firm name of Gilreath Harris & Co. in what is known
as the Gilreath Opera House Property, situate, lying
and being at the corner of Main and Coffee Streets
in the City of Greenville State and County aforesaid,
consisting of a lease right for a term of years in the
said lot of land upon which the Opera House is built,
the buildings and improvements upon said lot, the
