 and State of one said on Branches of Brashey  
 Creek Branch waters of Ennore River contain-  
 ing Nineteen and one half acres, be the same  
 more or less, Beginning at white oak 3 x 3 in.  
 thence S. 22 1/2 W. 12.88 to a stone W. E. Ross corner 3 x  
 3 in. thence N. 70 1/2 W. 11.80 to a stone on still house  
 branch 3 x 3 in. thence up the meanders of said  
 branch 5.85 to a corner wood 3 x 3 in. thence N. 49 1/2  
 E. 12.67 to a Spanish oak, down stake 3 x 3 in. thence  
 S. 40 E. 9.40 to the beginning corner bounded by
