To Certificate of Incorporation State of South Carolina

Whereas Yancy Cunningham, Joel Avery, Wm Butler, Johnson Nutridge<sup>and</sup> Daniel Walker did on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of January 1890 file with me in my office a written declaration signed by themselves setting forth 1<sup>st</sup> The names of the members of the corporation proposed in said written declaration and that they reside in the State of South Carolina<sup>and</sup> County of Greenville<sup>and</sup> in and near the city of Greenville 2<sup>nd</sup> That the name of the proposed corporation is the Home Protection Society<sup>and</sup> its place of location is the City of Greenville in the State<sup>and</sup> County aforesaid and that its general purpose is the mutual protection of its members by each member thereby paying into the treasury of said corporation the sum of two dollars on<sup>the</sup> in every two weeks to be used for the purpose of purchasing rations<sup>and</sup> food supplies for the members thereof and their families<sup>and</sup> by the accumulation of a fund to be raised by each member of said corporation paying the sum of twenty five cents per month into the treasury which sum shall be held as a reserve fund to be used as said corporation may direct<sup>and</sup> that one of the objects of said corporation is the mutual protection of its members<sup>and</sup> to care for and protect the disabled members thereof who

unable to perform the ordinary duties of their calling from bodily wounds, sickness or otherwise said support<sup>and</sup> care to continue during such disability Now Therefore I Alfred J. Mosley Clerk of the Court of the Court for the County of Greenville in the State of South Carolina by virtue of authority in me vested by an act of the General Assembly approved the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of December 1886 do hereby certify that said Yancy Cunningham, Joel Avery, Wm Butler, Johnson Nutridge<sup>and</sup> Daniel Walker and their associates are incorporated under the name of The Home Protection Society for the purposes named in said declaration Said declaration shall have the following provisos: 1<sup>st</sup> To make by laws not inconsistent with the laws of this State or the United States 2<sup>nd</sup> To have and use common seal and the same to change at pleasure 3<sup>rd</sup> To sue<sup>and</sup> be sued plead<sup>and</sup> impleaded 4<sup>th</sup> To have hold<sup>and</sup> keep such seal and personal property as may be property<sup>and</sup> necessary for corporate purposes<sup>and</sup> the same to sell, alien mortgage or otherwise dispose of at the will<sup>and</sup> pleasure of said corporation 5<sup>th</sup> And any other persons common to such corporation and consistent with the laws of the land In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Greenville I.C. this 10th day of January A.D 1890
