

Purchase and sale of all kinds of farm products and supplies and to do all that appertains to the receiving, handling, forwarding and marketing of said products and the purchase of supplies. To erect, manage and operate warehouses, stock yards, grain elevators and packing establishments; to manufacture guano and other fertilizers, and all other such enterprises as may be found necessary or desirable to their profit and betterment.

Third: The amount of Capital Stock to be Fifty Thousand Dollars, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be One Thousand shares of the par of Fifty Dollars each, that at least twenty percent of the Capital Stock subscribed will be required to be paid in, before the Certificate of full organization is issued as provided in section V of the Act hereinafter mentioned; and that remainder of such Capital Stock shall be paid in such instalments as shall be determined by the Board of Directors of the said Company who shall make such by laws for the management of the Company as they may deem advisable, and whereas on the sixteenth day of December 1889, the said Jas. C. Coit, J. M. Stone, J. D. Harrison, Joe H. Smith, J. H. Ferguson, W. H. Timmerman, W. O. Cain, and O. B. Riley, were commissioned by me as Board of Corporators, authorizing and empowering them to open books of subscription to the Capital Stock of said proposed Corporation, giving not less than one days previous notice by advertisement in a newspaper published in the County of Richland giving notice of the time and place where said books of subscription would be opened; and whereas the said Board of Corporators, on the nineteenth day of December A. D. 1889, did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying among other things, that a Board of Directors had been elected, and also a President and Secretary & Treasurer, that fifty percent of the Capital Stock has been subscribed by bona-fide subscribers, that twenty percent of the Capital subscribed has been paid in cash and the payment of the remainder of the Capital subscribed has been secured to be paid.

Now, therefore I, J. L. Marshall, Secretary of State, by virtue of the Authority in me vested by an Act of the General Assembly entitled "An Act to Provide for the Formation of Certain Corporations under General Laws" approved the twenty third day of December 1886, and the Act amendatory thereto approved Dec. 24, 1888, do hereby

certify that said company has been fully organized, according to the Laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their within Declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their Charter; and that a copy of this Certificate be filed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Meane Conveyances in each County where such Corporation shall have a business Office.
