S. Gray, J. D. Sullivan, O. J. Feltz, and J. E. Ware, that said Board of Directors elected, W. S. Gray, President, and Treasurer, and J. E. Ware Secretary. That forty two per cent of the Capital subscribed has been paid to the President and Treasurer and the remainder has been secured to be paid.

Now therefore J. L. Marshall, Secretary of State by virtue of the authority in me vested by an Act of the General Assembly, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Formation of Certain Corporations under the General Laws", approved the twenty third day of December 1886, do hereby certify that said Company has been fully organized, according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in this within Declaration and that they are fully authorized to commence business under this Charter and that a copy of this Certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meigs County and in each County where such Corporation shall have a business.
